FIREARMS AND AMMUNITION

	<p>2. Access:</p> <p>a. Targets are only to be accessed from the rear</p> <p>3. Range infrastructure is not to be used as targetry or to zero/check zero firearms</p> <p>4. Shotgun:</p> <p>a. Maximum of 2 firers per detail</p> <p>b. No mixing of shotguns and rifles within same detail</p> <p>5. A Suitably Qualified Experience Person (SQEP) is to be appointed as the responsible RO when shooting</p> <p>6. A maximum of two shots are permitted per run of the moving target</p> <p>a. Another shooter can dry fire from the alternate lane</p> <p>7. This range will predominantly be designated a Miniature rifle range under section 11.4 of the firearms act</p>
Firing positions	<p>8. Shotguns restricted to 10 – 25m</p> <p>9. Positions permitted:</p> <p>a. Sitting</p> <p>b. Kneeling</p> <p>c. Standing</p> <p>d. Benched</p> <p>10. Changes of position are permitted within any detail or practice outside competition providing all firers follow the same sequence, and in competition in accordance with the conditions</p>
Targetry	<p>11. MAX TCH: 1.5m</p> <p>12. Only targets from the BSR approved set may be used</p> <p>13. Targets are to be used in the frames or holders provided and are to be engaged only from the recognised firing points and/or appropriate shooting station or peg. Any deviation from this is to be notified and approved by the NSC head of Operations.</p> <p>14. Hard Targets:</p> <p>a. Non FAC airguns under 12ft/lbs permitted with prior approval of the BSR manager</p> <p>15. Clay pigeons are not to be engaged within Time Limit Range</p>
