<b>Description</b>	<p><b>Type:</b> Gallery Range</p> <p><b>Danger area:</b> Full Danger Area (FDA)</p> <p><b>Location</b> (What3words): Then.Prone.Merit</p> <p><b>Distance:</b> 100yds</p> <p><b>Targets:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 7 Static electronic targets (6 firing points)</li> </ul> <p><b>Additional notes:</b> There is open access to other ranges within the BSR complex (see coordinating instructions below)</p>
<b>FIREARMS AND AMMUNITION</b>	
<b>Permitted firearms and ammunition including ME &amp; MV</b>	<p><b>Type:</b> Rifles; gallery rifles. Shotguns and pistols by special arrangement only</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Maximum Muzzle Velocity:</b> 1000 m/s (3280 ft/s)</li> <li>• <b>Maximum Muzzle Energy:</b> 4500 J (3319 ft/lb)</li> </ul> <p><b>HME Permitted:</b> 4500J – 7000J HME procedures apply</p> <p><b>Special Requirements:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Muzzle brakes permitted with consent of adjacent shooters</li> <li>• Vermin calibre MR not exceeding 1350 m/s (4429 ft/s) may be used providing ME does not exceed 2600 J (1918 ft/lb)</li> </ul> <p><b>Not Permitted:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• .22 Hornet</li> <li>• .22-250</li> <li>• .220 Swift</li> </ul>
<b>RANGE SAFETY LIMITATIONS</b>	
<b>Coordinating Instructions</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Shooting on this range affects the following ranges: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>BSR <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Running Boar</li> <li>Running Deer</li> </ol> </li> <li>Melville</li> <li>Stickledown</li> <li>Pirbright</li> </ol> </li> <li><b>Access:</b> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>All movement forward of the Statics Range firing point requires the following ranges to have ceased fire: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Statics</li> <li>Running Boar</li> <li>Running Deer</li> </ol> </li> <li>When there are personnel forward of the firing points, the red flag system is to be followed under the direction of the BSR Manager</li> <li>When shooting is conducted from the turning target firing</li> </ol> </li> </ol>

	<p>points on Running Deer, the BSR Manager is to ensure demarcation lines are set up between Running Deer and Statics range to ensure safe access/egress</p> <p>3. Range infrastructure is not to be used as targetry or to zero/check zero firearms</p> <p>4. A Suitably Qualified Experience Person (SQEP) is to be appointed as the responsible RO when shooting</p> <p>5. Vehicles are not permitted on the range floor without prior permission from the BSR manager</p>
<b>Firing positions</b>	<p>6. <b>Positions permitted:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. Prone</li> <li>b. Sitting</li> <li>c. Kneeling</li> <li>d. Standing</li> <li>e. Benched</li> </ul> <p>7. When shooters are firing from different positions there is to be a common firing line.</p> <p>8. Changes of position are permitted within any detail or practice outside competition providing all firers follow the same sequence, and in competition in accordance with the conditions</p>
<b>Targetry</b>	<p>9. <b>MAX TCH:</b> 1.5m</p> <p>10. Only targets from the BSR approved set may be used</p> <p>11. Targets are to be used in the frames or holders provided and are to be engaged only from the recognised firing points and/or appropriate shooting station or peg. Any deviation from this is to be notified and approved by the NSC Head of Operations.</p> <p>12. Falling Plates or other hard targets may not be engaged within Statics Range</p> <p>13. Clay pigeons are not to be engaged within Statics Range</p>
